FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI – THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

As part of the final blessing each time we attend Mass, we are asked to go forth in faith and love, taking up the mission of Jesus and spreading the fruits of the Eucharist. Our participation in the Eucharist at Mass unites us with Jesus and with one another in a unique and intimate way that defines our very identity as baptised children of God and our call to mission. We pray today that our familiarity with Holy Communion and with the dismissal words of the Mass will never allow us to become complacent about the everlasting gift that Jesus gave us or its centrality to the responsibilities and challenges that come with the privilege.

‘I am the living bread which has come down from heaven, says the Lord. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.’

The **Feast of Corpus Christi** reminds us of one of our central beliefs as Catholics, namely that Jesus is fully and truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. So, when we receive Holy Communion, we are receiving Jesus Himself into our bodies and souls.

This belief, and our celebration of it today especially, challenges us to respect the presence of Jesus in our brothers and sisters too. Just as the Eucharist is the Body of Christ, so too are we who call ourselves Christians, followers and disciples of Jesus Christ.

Therefore, the question we might ask ourselves today (and every day) is: does my respect for the Jesus I worship in the tabernacle, or in the monstrance, when I’m at Mass and / or receive Holy Communion, translate into respect for my neighbour, particularly my neighbour who is most vulnerable or most in need?

CALENDAR FOR THE WEEK AHEAD

Sunday 6th The annual feast of Corpus Christi gives us the opportunity to reflect on and give thanks for the mystery we celebrate every Sunday and every day. The Eucharist is the Church's food of life and our daily bread.

Monday 7th St Colman. Settled at Dromore, Co Down about 514, and became bishop there.

Wednesday 9th St Columba (Colm Cille), abbot and missionary, Patron of the Diocese of Derry and secondary patron of Ireland. Born at Gartan in Co. Donegal in 521, he studied under St Finian of Moville and St Finian of Clonard and founded monasteries at Durrow, Derry and possibly Kells. In 563 he left for Iona, which became his principal foundation, and from there missionaries went out on their work of conversion. He is noted for his great love for people and all living creatures. He died in 597.

Thursday 10th St Ephrem the Syrian (306-373) was a native of Mesopotamia and became a monk and deacon near Edessa in modern Turkey. He wrote commentaries on scripture, and hymns which were later included in the liturgy. He defended the faith against Arianism and encouraged devotion to Our Lady.

Friday 11th The Sacred Heart of Jesus, a feast that celebrates the immense love of God for us revealed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

St Barnabas was born in Cyprus and was one of the first converts in Jerusalem before he went to preach in Antioch. He became a companion of St Paul and accompanied him on his first missionary journey. He returned to Cyprus to preach, where he died.
