Take a break

We all need a break sometimes. I remember once reading a selection of entries for a Mother's Day competition, in which people were asked why their mother deserved to win a prize. They all had themes in common – she never does anything for herself; she's always thinking of other people; I can't remember the last time she took a break.

In today's Gospel, the disciples need a break. They have returned from their mission, eager to catch up with Jesus, but there is so much happening that they barely have time to eat. Jesus sees their need and invites them to take a boat with him to a quiet place and rest for a while. But there is no time for rest, as the crowds have followed them on foot. Jesus is moved by them because they are 'like sheep without a shepherd'. He is the Good Shepherd who always cares for his flock, and he responds with compassion and love.

No doubt the disciples are drafted in to help: it turns out it is not break time! We can imagine their exhaustion. We all feel tired or overwhelmed from time to time, from work or family pressures or simply trying to balance everything. Postponing our own needs to care for others is familiar to every parent or caregiver. We don't know if the disciples got a rest at that point, but we know that Jesus valued time apart as he later sends the disciples off in the boat again while he goes away by himself to pray. In the chaos of life, even when there are demands on our time and energy, it is important to take some time to reflect and to pray.

Feasts during the Week: Wednesday - St. Lawrence of Brindisi (1559 -**1619**): Capuchin who preached the Counter-Reformation. He led German armies against the Turks in Hungary and gained peace for the people of Naples. **Thursday** - St. Mary Magdalene: Stood by the cross of Jesus; with two other women she discovered the empty tomb; she was granted an appearance of the Risen Lord early the same day, from which incident she has been described as 'the apostle to the apostles'. The Gospels give no warrant for identifying her with the 'woman who was a sinner' who anointed Christ's feet (Lk 7:37) or Mary the sister of Martha who also anointed him (Jn 12:3). Friday - St. Bridget: Was born in Sweden in 1303. She brought up eight children, and after the death of her husband dedicated her herself to an ascetical life. Later she founded the Bridgettine Order and loved in Rome. She wrote many works about her mystical appearances. She died in Rome in 1373. She was declared a Patron of Europe in 2000. Saturday - St. **Declan:** Is considered to be one of the pre-Patrician saints. He was of noble blood. Colman, a local priest, baptised him. Later he went to Europe to continue his studies where he was ordained priest and possibly bishop. He settled in Ardmore and evangelised the Decies country.
